John Stewart's life as a businessman, volunteer and philanthropist follows his principle of financial stewardship. In Wellington, Kan. Stewart transformed two small aerospace companies into a multi-national presence. He serves as a Director of INTRUST Financial Corp., Chairman of the First National Bank in Wellington, Chairman of the Caldwell State Bank and managing Member of Stewart Farms, LC.

Graduating from the KU School of Business in 1958, John's business and civic contributions have benefited his community and the University in numerous ways. He is a former chairman of the KU Endowment Association and former president of the Alumni Association. He was instrumental in establishing the John T. Stewart Children's Center, named for his father and most recently, gave the lead gift in the restoration of Danforth Chapel on the KU Campus.

John was presented the Fred Ellsworth Medallion in 1978 and the Distinguished Service Citation in 1990 for his dedication and extraordinary vision which have helped shape educational, financial and civic institutions.
